# CARING FOR THE EARTH: CLC RANKS AS TOP TWO-YEAR SCHOOL IN ILLINOIS

Did you know that CLC is the top Illinois community college and ranks in the top two in the Midwest for its efforts to promote environmental sustainability? That's according to the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education. CLC's green accomplishments include:

- A \$148 million sustainable master plan, which includes new and renovated buildings designed to meet LEED Gold and Platinum standards. The new Science & Engineering Building contains 187 solar photovoltaic panels, a 1,500 square-foot green roof and a system that harvests rainwater to flush toilets. Besides energy-saving LED lights in campus parking lots, a new geothermal heating and cooling system is expected to trim energy costs by up to 50 percent in three wings.



- A Grayslake Campus farm that grows fresh vegetables, and a 10-hive apiary that expands local food production. Honey from the managed bee colony is sold in Café Willow on the Grayslake Campus and other campus stores. The campus farm uses integrated pest management and organic methods to grow vegetables and greens for sale at the farm market and Café Willow.
- Sustainability-related degrees and certificates, and 23 percent of college course offerings containing all or some element of sustainability.

## BUILD, TEST YOUR NEXT BIG IDEA AT BAXTER INNOVATION LAB

Looking for a cool place to innovate, design and build mock-ups and prototypes for life-changing products? The new Baxter Innovation Lab is the first public fab lab/ makerspace in Lake County and opened in fall 2018. Funded by Baxter International, Inc. and CLC, the lab is located in the Technology Wing at the Grayslake Campus. The space is ideal for:

- Students majoring in engineering, engineering technology or computerized numerical control

- Students learning machine tool trades, computer aided design, the sciences, or even art
- Individuals, inventors, school groups, K-12 robotics teams, small-businesses and other groups who need a place to build and test their ideas

The lab contains the latest engineering design software, such as AutoDesk Inventor® and SolidWorks®, in addition to multiple 3D printers used to create design prototypes. Other digital prototyping equipment includes: laser cutters; CNC machines for milling, routing and printed circuit boards; and an electronics workstation. The lab also has basic wood and metalworking capabilities, including hand tools, drill press, power saws and a lathe.

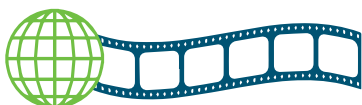


## DENTAL HYGIENE CLINIC:

“I liked the dedication shown by the students and instructors in Honors classes, such as speech, English composition and history,” said Hauck, a Wauconda resident who earned an A.A. in 2018. “The classes also were smaller than traditional ones and had a seminar-type atmosphere, with less structure, and more discussions, which allowed me to get to know classmates and instructors.”

Through the Scholars program, which combines rigorous courses and a part-time job on campus, Hauck was able to help finance her education through a full-tuition scholarship.

Now majoring in psychology and English at Vanderbilt University, Hauck said she eventually plans to earn a master’s degree in psychology, attend law school and become an attorney.

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## PAYMENT PLAN OPTIONS

Unable to pay for your entire semester at once?

CLC offers an **Installment Payment Plan** for your convenience.

This is not a loan program, so there are no interest or finance charges and no credit check. The only cost is a non-refundable enrollment fee of \$25.

### Ways you may budget your tuition:

- **Automatic Bank Payment:** These are bank-to-bank transfers of funds you have pre-approved for your CLC expenses, which may come from either your checking or savings account. Payments for the deferred payment plan are processed on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of each month and continue until the balance is paid in full.
- **Credit Card:** This option allows you to take advantage of any bonus programs offered by your credit card. Your monthly payment will be automatically charged to the credit card you designate. 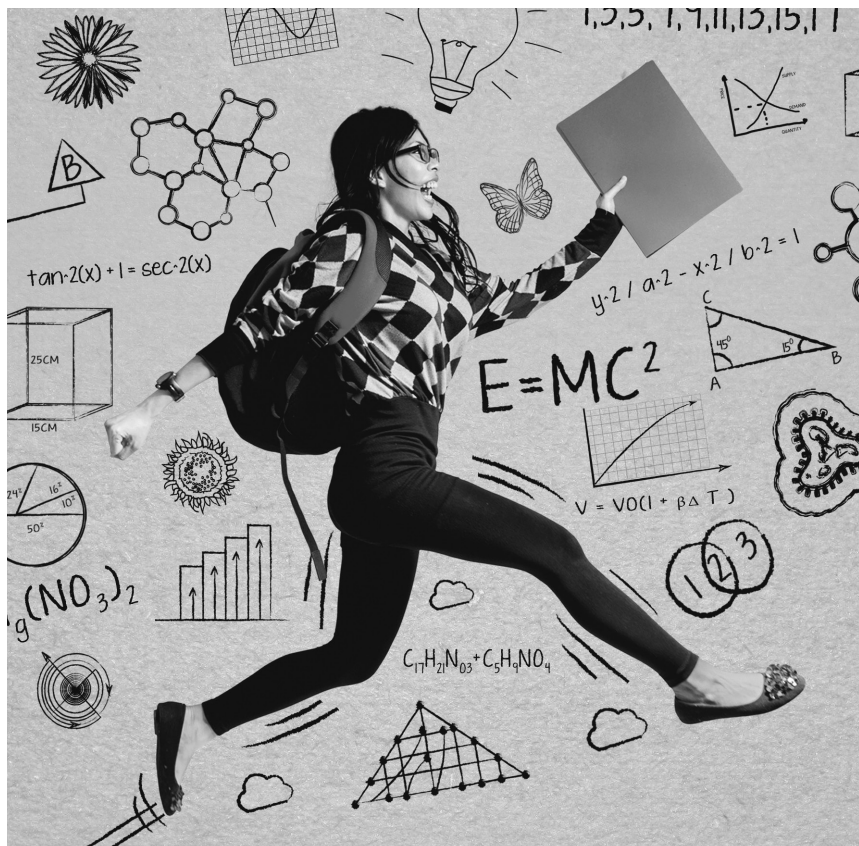
