Transfer Planning Guide – CRIMINAL JUSTICE MAJOR
 Use in tandem with CC-MO general transfer guide

All grades must be a “C” or higher for transfer

Open enrollment for transfer to CC-MO

No courses are required for admission to the Criminal Justice major; however, the courses noted below are required to earn the baccalaureate degree and may be taken at CLC.

Students are recommended to have completed the AA or AS with the following coursework:

| Social/Behavioral Sciences: | PSC 121; SOC 121; PSY 121; (HST 121, 122,221,222) |
| Electives: | CIT 120; CRJ 121, 122, 123, 124, 216, 221, 222, 229 |

If not completing the AA/AS at CLC, it is **recommended** that you include the following courses for the Criminal Justice core and for general education. The courses noted will also meet requirements for students completing the AAS degree.

General Education (some Criminal Justice Core included):

- ENG 121, 122
- CIT 120
- CMM 121
- MTH 122, 127, 144 or 145¹
- 6 hours from: HST 121, 122, 221, 222
- Arts/Humanities (6 hours): select from: ART 121, ART 240*, ART 241; ENG 225, 226, 228*, 229, 241, 243, 244*; MUS 124; PHI 121, 122, 221*
**course meets CC-MO's Multicultural requirement*
- Social/Behavioral: PSC 121; SOC 121; SOC 225; PSYC 121
- Science/Math: 5 hours (two courses needed): May fulfill in one of two ways:
 - Take either: [MTH (142 or 222); MTH 145¹], and choose one from: BIO 120, BIO 161; CHM 120 or 121; ESC 121 or 140; PHY 111 or 121
 - or-
 - Two science courses from: BIO 120, BIO 161; CHM 120 or 121; ESC 121 or 140; PHY 111 or 121 (two science lectures recommended).

¹ MTH 145 will fulfill CC-MO's Basic Skills Math OR Math/Science but will NOT fulfill requirements for both areas.

Criminal Justice Core:

- CRJ 121, 122, 123, 124, 216, 221, 222, 229
- additional CRJ courses will be reviewed for electives
