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<sup>1</sup>EIU – Must take MTH 122 College Algebra or earn a Math score of 26 or higher on the ACT.

<sup>2</sup>EIU – May take PSY 121 or ANT (121 or 221) or SOC 222 or PSC 222.

<sup>3</sup>EIU – EDU 121 & 124 & 242 is equivalent to EIU's ELE 2050. EDU 242 serves to satisfy the clinical hours which is a licensure requirement covered by EIU's ELE 2050.

<sup>4</sup>ISU - Must take a course in College Algebra or show proficiency by taking ALEKS test at ISU.

<sup>5</sup>ISU - GEG 122 or 123 may be used to fulfill ISU's Global Studies requirement and the Geography requirement simultaneously.

<sup>6</sup>NLU –May be met with any intro course in art, music, theatre, fine arts history or appreciation courses. Studio Arts and Performance courses cannot be used.

<sup>7</sup>NLU –EDU 124 (or PSY 222) and EDU 225 are equivalent to NLU's EPS 300.

<sup>8</sup>NLU – These courses require an earned grade of B or better in order to transfer.

<sup>9</sup>NEIU –Math requirement is 9 credit hours: students taking MTH 121 and 221 at CLC are required to take MATH 151 at NEIU upon transfer. May take MATH 149 & 150 at NEIU.

<sup>10</sup>NEIU – NEIU has a humanities requirement of 9 credit hours: must take ENGL 205 at NEIU: See the NEIU Transfer Course Equivalency Guide courses meeting the HUM designation.

<sup>11</sup>NEIU – NEIU requires Elementary Education transfer students to take NEIU's BIOS 110 upon transfer (there is no equivalent at CLC).

<sup>12</sup>NIU – MTH 122 or higher OR placement into higher than MTH 122.

<sup>13</sup>NIU – MUS 126 & 127 or contact an NIU Elementary Education advisor for *possible* course substitutions.

<sup>14</sup>SIUC –SIUC's campus program only, for information on SIUC's Elementary Education program at the University Center, please see transfer guide.

<sup>15</sup>SIUC - Please see SIUC Education Transfer Guide for additional notes. Especially if not completing the AA/AS/IAI before transferring.

<sup>18</sup>UIUC – Please see UIUC Transfer Guide for details. In order to meet ISBE State standards, students are advised to take courses that meet the general education requirements from three of the following different rubrics: Anthropology, Economics, Geography (fulfilling only the Social Science General Education requirements), History, Global Studies, Political Science, Sociology and Psychology, when fulfilling the **Cultural Studies, Humanities, and Social Science requirements**.

<sup>19</sup>UIUC - Students are required to complete through 2 years in high school or through the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester in college of a single foreign language for admission. For graduation, students will need to complete through 3 years in high school or through the 3<sup>rd</sup> semester in college.

<sup>20</sup>UIC – It is recommended that you meet with a UIC College of Education advisor and use Transferology.com to view program requirements.

<sup>21</sup>UIC – Run a program with equivalencies in Transferology to view options for requirements for Understanding the Creative Arts.

<sup>22</sup>UIC – Analyzing the World Physical Systems (Life Science) can be met with: BIO 120, 123, 141, 161, 162

<sup>23</sup>UIC – Analyzing the World Bio systems (Physical Science) can be met with: CHM 121, 123, ESC 120, 121, 127, 140, PHY 121, 122

<sup>24</sup>UIC – Run a program with equivalencies in Transferology to view options for requirements for Exploring World Cultures.

<sup>25</sup>WIU – One science course must have a lab.
