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This transfer guide is designed to assist students with their academic planning. TRANSFER OPTIONS

Completed AA or AS degree: CLC students will enter with junior standing and all NIU general education requirements will be considered complete if the AA, AS, or approved AAT degree has been earned prior to enrolling at NIU. Individual "limited admission" majors may have additional prerequisites and/or requirements that are not covered by this agreement. General education requirements will be considered fulfilled upon receipt of an official transcript from CLC showing completion of the AA or AS degree. Special general education requirements apply to electrical, industrial, and mechanical engineering and an AA/AS does not automatically meet these requirements.

IAI GECC: Completing *only* the IAI General Education Core at CLC (no AA/AS) will be evaluated by NIU as completing the lower division general education requirements. Individual "limited admission" majors may have additional prerequisites and/or requirements that are not covered by this agreement.

Completing some courses at CLC: If transferring prior to completing the IAI General Education Core at CLC, students will be required to follow NIU's general education requirements to complete the baccalaureate degree.

TRANSFER CREDITS

The maximum number of semester hours transferable from a community college is 66 academic hours plus 4 hours of P.E. activity courses. Additional credit for military service is possible. ***Please note: NIU will accept completed transfer work with a grade of D. Be advised that a grade of C or better is necessary to meet the requirements for many foundational studies courses, prerequisite courses, majors, minors and certificates.** Course equivalencies can be viewed at: <http://www.niu.edu/admissions/pdf/articulation-tables/lake-county.pdf>

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants who have attempted **up to and including 12 hours of credit** will be evaluated as a freshman for admission purposes and must meet the current freshman admission requirements (ACT or SAT and HS rank). The grade point average earned for the 12 (or less) attempted hours will not affect the admission decision.
- Students with **12 – 23 transferable hours of credit** must satisfy both freshman and transfer admission criteria.
- **60+ transferable earned credits or an AA/AS/AAT:** minimum 2.0 cumulative transfer GPA and be in good standing at last school attended.
- **Minimum GPA's for consideration:** Accountancy 3.0 (Not a limited admission major. However, must meet retention after review); Art Education 2.75; Business other 2.5 (Not a limited admission major. However, must meet retention after review); Medical Lab Sciences 2.5; Computer Science 2.5; Early Childhood 2.5 75 (Not a limited admission major. However, must meet retention after review); Elementary Education 2.75 (Not a limited admission major. However, must meet retention after review); Fashion Merchandising (Not a limited admission major. However, must have C's or better in major courses to progress); Health Sciences: Pre-Physical Therapy 3.0 (Not a limited admission major. However, must meet retention after 45 credits earned.); Hospitality & Tourism Management (Not a limited admission major. However, must have C's or better in major courses to progress); Human Development and Family Sciences 2.2 (Not a limited admission major. However, must meet retention after review); Special Education 2.5; (Not a limited admission major. However, must meet retention after review); See catalog for other limited admission program requirements.

- **Communicative Disorders Update:** Minor is required to graduate from NIU. Please consider taking courses toward a minor at College of Lake County, with consultation with NIU advisors.
- **Nutrition, Dietetics and Wellness:** Students should seek advisement to ensure that they have completed their organic chemistry and general biology requirements prior to transferring to NIU.

CALCULATION OF ADMISSION GPA

For students transferring without the AA, AS, or AAT degree, repeated courses for which a grade of "C" or better was received in the first attempt will not be calculated in the admission GPA, nor will such a course be accepted for transfer credit. If "D" or "F" courses are repeated, the second attempt only will be utilized in calculating the GPA. Certain majors require special admission grading policies.

Medical Lab Science: Fall only 2/1
Nursing: Fall only (except RNS) 1/15;

FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

Students seeking a Bachelor of Arts degree must complete either 4 years of the same language in high school w/no grade lower than a "C" or Seal of Biliteracy or 2 years in college.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships: www.scholarships.niu.edu. Merit based deadlines: fall- 3/1 and spring 10/1

- Transfer- Merit-based scholarship for full time degree seeking students: 3.5/4.0 GPA and 30 transferable credit hours = \$2,000 towards tuition per year for two years, or 3.25 - 3.49 GPA with 30 hours = \$1500 towards tuition per year for two years, or 3.0 - 3.249 GPA with 30 hours = \$1000 towards tuition per year for two years, if application is complete by merit based scholarship deadlines; Legacy Scholarship: Merit-based scholarship valued at \$1,000 for the incoming child of NIU alumnus/a

SPECIAL NOTES

- Prospective Art, Music and Theatre majors are encouraged to transfer after one year.
- Computer Science majors who transfer to NIU as juniors may need additional time (one to two summers or an additional fall or spring semester) to graduate from NIU.
- Business majors: complete MTH 222 and calculus course (MTH 224 or 145) prior to transfer; if these are not completed it can take an additional one - two years to complete the business course sequence at NIU.
- There is a confirmation process for admitted transfer students. Once students are admitted, they will receive an initial transfer credit evaluation and an invitation to the orientation programs. Orientation registration confirms intent of enrollment.
- NIU accepts CLEP credit; students are asked to contact NIU's Office of Testing Services: 815-753-1203.
