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<sup>1</sup>DePaul – Requirements vary between the BA and BS and between concentrations in Psychology. This table reflects Standard BA Psychology requirements.

<sup>2</sup>DePaul – Take MTH 140 or 141.

<sup>3</sup>DePaul – Take PSY 224 and 225, and may choose four electives from PSY (129 or 229), 221, 222, 223, 226.

<sup>4</sup>ISU – One math course required: choose MTH 127, 224, 144 or 145. The required PSY statistics course with SPSS labs will be taken at ISU.

<sup>5</sup>ISU –Must complete two lab courses.

<sup>6</sup>ISU –Limit of PSY courses is 16 hours from a community college for the Psychology major. PSY (220 or 222) and PSY 224 fulfill course requirements for the PSY major.

<sup>7</sup>ISU –AMALI (Global Studies) requirement. See ISU General Reference Guide for Course options.

<sup>8</sup>NEIU –This table is based on students who complete the AA or IAI GECC at CLC, as this fulfills NEIU’s Gen Ed requirements. Otherwise, students need to complete NEIU’s Gen Ed requirements (see transfer guide) which **do not include CMM 121, or math** (the math requirement will be fulfilled at NEIU by taking PSYC 302), and **DOES include 3 natural science courses, 3 humanities and 2 fine arts courses.**

<sup>9</sup>NEIU –Limit of PSY courses is three for the Psychology major: PSY 121, and choose PSY 220 or 222, and choose one of the following: 221, 223, 224, 225, 226.

<sup>10</sup>UIUC – ENG 120 or 121 and ENG 122 or 126.

<sup>11</sup>UIUC – Must take a QR1 or QR2 course from Campus Wide General Education Requirements.

<sup>12</sup>UIUC – Limit of PSY courses is three for the Psychology major: PSY 121 and choose two of the following: PSY 122, 222, 223, 224, 225.

<sup>13</sup>UIC –Quantitative Reasoning can be met with: MTH [(122 and 123) or 144], 127, 224, 141, 145, 222, 225 or PHI 122.

<sup>14</sup>UIC – Analyzing the Natural World: Two Labs required. Run a program with equivalencies in Transferology to view options.

<sup>15</sup>UIC – Take at least one from: PSY 220, 223, 224, 225.

<sup>16</sup>UWP – Take PSY 220 and PSY 225.

<sup>17</sup>UWP –Take one Ethnic Diversity: ANT 228, CMM 111, EDU 224, ENG 263, GXS 229, GXS 299, HST 240, HST 241, HST 246, PDS 123, SOC 229, THE 123.
