

**SOUTHERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY - CARBONDALE**  
**Transfer Planning Guide – Criminology and Criminal Justice MAJOR**  
 Use in tandem with SIUC general transfer guide

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### Admission Requirements

1. Complete an application for admission into the university with a major in Criminology and Criminal Justice.
2. Overall minimum cumulative GPA requirement of 2.0/4.0 as calculated by SIU.
3. Minimum of 26 semester hours of transfer coursework completed at time of entry to SIU. Students with less than 26 hours must meet freshman admission requirements and submit ACT or SAT scores and an official high school transcript.
