Admission Requirements

1. Complete an application for admission into the university with a major in Architectural Studies
2. Overall minimum cumulative GPA requirement of 2.6/4.0
3. Minimum of 26 semester hours of transfer coursework completed at time of entry to SIUC
4. Students are encouraged to transfer to SIUC after one year at CLC as the program will take at least 3 years to complete after arriving at SIUC. Students should apply to the program to start at SIUC in the summer semester.
