- Applicants to the College of Applied Health Sciences are encouraged to apply with as few as 30 transferable hours by the term of entry. Sophomore level transfer students will be evaluated on the following criteria: Grades in college, courses in college, high school academics (required to submit official high school transcripts), and ACT or SAT scores (official exam scores are required for students who do not have 30 graded hours of transferable credit at the time of application).
- Must have a minimum of 30 transferable hours completed by time of entry. Students should choose from the UIUC General Education course requirements in order to meet the 30-59 hours of transferable credit required.
- Using the application essays, explain the relationship between your career choice and your extracurricular and work experiences.
- Since the required courses for general education categories vary by curriculum within academic departments, please refer to the department of the intended major for specific requirements, which can be found at: <http://www.ahs.illinois.edu>

Minimum Required GPA: 2.8 (for transfer students w/60+ hours by the time they matriculate to UIUC);
3.0 (for transfer students w/fewer than 60 hours)

MAJOR REQUIREMENTS	
All courses listed below are highly recommended to be completed prior to transfer	
MAJOR	COURSES
Community Health	Foreign Language; Composition I; CMM 121; MTH 142 or 222; HWP 240 Students interested in the Health Planning and Administration concentration should consider completing courses in Accounting, Economics, Marketing, Management, and/or Advertising as electives.
Interdisciplinary Health Sciences	Foreign Language; Composition I; PSY 121; HUS 121; MTH 142 or 222
Kinesiology	Foreign Language; Composition I; CMM 121; BIO 244 and 245; MTH 142 or 222 or another Quantitative Reasoning 1 course; PSY 121 Strong science coursework is extremely critical for Kinesiology majors.
Recreation, Sport, and Tourism	Foreign Language; Composition I; CMM 121; Quantitative Reasoning I Students should consider completing supporting courses in Advertising, Business, Marketing, Communications, Leadership, Urban Planning, Public Relations.
Speech and Hearing Science	Foreign Language (Spanish is recommended); Composition I; MTH 142 or 222; Biological or physical Science course. See Transfer Handbook for more details. Strong science coursework is extremely critical for Speech and Hearing Science majors.

Composition I	(ENG 120 and (122 or 126)) OR (ENG 121 and (122 or 126))
Advanced Comp.	Must be taken at UIUC
Foreign Language	There is no language requirement for transfer <i>admission</i> . For <i>graduation</i> , students will need to complete through 3 years in high school or through the 3rd semester in college. It is strongly recommended that transfer applicants complete this graduation requirement prior to their enrollment at UIUC. Eligible courses are listed on the Campus Wide list. <i>Students applying to Speech and Hearing Science are strongly encouraged to study Spanish because of the high demand for Spanish as a second language.</i>
Humanities & the Arts: 6 hours	
Natural Sciences and Technology: 6 hours	
Quantitative Reasoning: 2 courses	
Social & Behavioral Sciences: 6 hours	
Cultural Studies (9 hours): Non-Western (1 course); US Minority Cultures (1 course); Western/Comparative Cultures (1 course)
