Note: The Gies College of Business doesn't accept transfer students to the Supply Chain Management major.

- 1) The College of Business accepts transfers with 24-50+ semester hours of transferable coursework for **FALL semester admission only**.
- 2) **Students who have completed less than 30 semester hours** of credit in college prior to application are evaluated primarily on the following criteria: grades in college, courses in college, high school academics, ACT or SAT scores, and essays, with transfer admission preference given to students who would have been admitted as freshmen.
- 3) **Required courses and hours must be completed by the end of the spring semester** - you may not complete course requirements or admissions hours during the summer prior to fall enrollment.
- 4) **Admission is extremely competitive** and not every qualified student is accepted. The college will utilize a holistic review process which will assess the entire student record (academic performance, demonstrated analytical and critical thinking skills, leadership ability, work experience, and two essays completed with the application).
- 5) All supporting documentation must be received by the Office of Undergraduate Admissions before the application will be reviewed. Transfer information is available at the following website: <http://www.transferology.com>
- 6) While review of your academic qualifications is of major focus, the essay you complete offers a better indication of why you want to study business at the University of Illinois and the goals you have for your future.
 - a. Your statements should include: Interest or experience in business; Employment or volunteer activities; State or national recognition for talent, creative ability, leadership, or academic achievement; An ethnic or cultural background or an age group that will add diversity to campus; Extenuating circumstances that significantly affected an otherwise exceptionally good academic record; Any other information that you feel would complete your profile.
 - b. If a student applies for a second major, they will need to include a second essay addressing the same as above.
- 7) Equivalent transfer courses to the University of Illinois' General Education and Business core coursework cannot be completed using either the credit/no credit or pass/fail options for this college and must be completed for letter grades.

The University of Illinois Business Major's TRANSFER ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

For transfer students with 24-49 graded, transferable semester hours, the following courses MUST be completed by the spring semester prior to transfer:	
Transfer GPA	Between 3.00 - 4.00; the GPA range for Fall 2018 accepted applicants was 3.6-4.0
Composition I	(ENG 120 and (122 or 126)) OR (ENG 121 and (122 or 126))
Mathematics	MTH 145 or 224
Micro and Macro Economics	ECO 221 and 222
Foreign Language	Must have completed through 3 years in high school or through the 2 nd semester in college of a single foreign language for <i>admission</i> . For <i>graduation</i> , students will need to complete through 4 years in high school or through the 4th semester in college. See Campus Wide General Education list for eligible courses.
Completion of the following courses prior to transfer is <u>highly recommended</u> : CMM 121; One of the following: CIT 134, 137, 141, MCS 121, 140, 141 or 142	

For transfer students with 50+ graded, transferable semester hours the following courses MUST be completed by the spring semester prior to transfer:	
Transfer GPA	3.00 - 4.00; the GPA range for Fall 2018 accepted applicants was 3.6-4.0
Composition I	(ENG 120 and (122 or 126)) OR (ENG 121 and (122 or 126))
Mathematics	MTH 145 or 224
Micro and Macro Economics	ECO 221 and 222
Foreign Language	Must have completed through 3 years in high school or through the 2 nd semester in college of a single foreign language for <i>admission</i> . For <i>graduation</i> , students will need to complete through 4 years in high school or through the 4th semester in college. See Campus Wide General Education list for eligible courses.
Accounting I and II	ACC 121 and 122 (must take both at same institution for them to transfer applicably)
Completion of the following courses prior to transfer is <u>highly recommended</u> : CMM 121; One of the following: CIT 134, 137, 141, MCS 121, 140, 141 or 142	

In addition to meeting the Business Major's TRANSFER ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS, students should also select CLC courses to meet the University General Education requirements. Fulfilling the General Education courses is not a requirement for admission, but it is recommended to complete many of these courses before transfer.

GENERAL EDUCATION Graduation Requirements for Business Majors See the Campus Wide Gen Ed list for CLC course options	
Advanced Composition	This course must be taken at the University of Illinois
Cultural Studies (3 courses)	Non-Western Cultures (1 course); U.S. Minority Cultures (1 course from ASI 121; HST 240, 241; SOC 225); Western/Comparative Cultures (1 course). Recommend students select from the following courses which will also fulfill the Humanities & the Arts: ENG 223, 229; HST 121, (HST 122 <u>or</u> (123 <u>and</u> 124)), 126, 221, 222, 240, 241; HUM 121, 122, 128, 129, 141; PHI 126, 221
Humanities & the Arts (3 courses)	Historical & Philosophical Perspectives (at least 1 course) Literature & the Arts (at least 1 course) One course must be selected from the following: HST 240, 241; ENG 223, 227, 229, 246
Natural Sciences & Technology (2 courses)	Life Sciences Physical Sciences Recommended that students take one course in each area
Social & Behavioral Sciences (2 courses)	*Note: for Management majors PSY 225 is a major degree requirement. Strongly recommend taking PSY 121 for those majors, as it is a prerequisite for PSY 225.
