1. Students interested in transferring to the College of Education are highly encouraged to visit the website at: <http://education.illinois.edu/programs/information-for/transfer-students> and submit the online form under the heading, "Please Contact the COE for further information". Consultation with the COE regarding a plan of study is strongly recommended.
2. **Fall and Spring admission** available. Time to degree is determined by completion of program requirements via transferrable coursework.
3. Candidates are required to **pass the Illinois Licensure Testing System (ILTS) Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP)** prior to student teaching. The Illinois State Board of Education determined the ACT Plus Writing/SAT scores can be used in lieu of a passing score on the Test of Academic Proficiency. 4. Grades below a C in content and professional education coursework, CR/NC coursework, and proficiency credit may **not** be used for State of Illinois Certification, Endorsements, or Approvals. AP credit is acceptable.

| ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS | |
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| Foreign Language | Students are required to complete through 2 years in high school or through the 2nd semester in college of a single foreign language for <u>admission</u>. For <u>graduation</u> , students will need to complete through 3 years in high school or through the 3 rd semester in college. It is strongly encouraged to complete the COE's Language Requirement for graduation prior to transfer. |
