- All courses in **bold** must be completed prior to transfer; courses not in bold are recommended to be completed prior to transfer. **All programs require completion of Quantitative Reasoning I and Composition I prior to transfer.**
- Most Fine & Applied Art programs are open for fall semester transfer only: Urban Planning, Music and Dance will accept fall and spring applications.
- Due to sequencing within the College of Fine + Applied Arts curriculum, students are encouraged to contact the school they intend to transfer to as early as possible to map out a course plan. Depending on the community college, you may be able to transfer and finish in 2 + 2 years, while others may work best with a 1 + 3 plan. For most of the degree programs in the College of Fine and Applied Arts, the application to transfer should start during their first semester of college so they start their sophomore year at Illinois.
- Students interested in majoring in any Visual or Performing Art must pass each program's qualifying audition and/or portfolio review. The length of study for transfer students is determined on an individual basis and depends on the technical level, rate of creative development, and number of transferable courses.
- Music majors require completion of the supplemental Music application, which may include a successful audition, interview, and/or placement exam. Transfer credit for all music skills toward any music degree will be subject to audition or placement exam.
- For the Dance and Theatres majors, the GPA requirement is a 2.25 (3.00 or higher preferred). Application after the first year is highly recommended because the student will be in sequenced courses for three additional years to complete the BFA in Dance or BFA in Theatre. - Art and Music Education majors are required to pass the Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP) prior to admission (the ACT Plus Writing/SAT scores can be used in lieu of the TAP). For details see: http://cote.illinois.edu/certification/documents/act_procedures_for_admission.pdf
- Landscape Architecture is a 4+ year program of study, 4 years of study, plus a required summer internship.

Major courses may be used to satisfy general education requirements provided they are on the appropriate general education list.

Foreign Language (completion of this requirement is highly recommended but not required for music)	Students are required to complete through 2 years in high school or through the 2 nd semester in college of a single foreign language for <u>admission</u> . For <u>graduation</u> , students will need to complete through 3 years in high school or through the 3rd semester in college. Eligible courses are listed on the Campus Wide list. Art History, Music History, Music/Vocal Performance have different graduation requirements – consult FAA advisor.
