

**Guaranteed Transfer Admission Agreement Between
College of Lake County
And
Marquette University**

College of Lake County ("CLC") and Marquette University ("MU") agree to a cooperative relationship through this Guaranteed Admission Agreement ("the agreement") to better serve students and facilitate the transfer process.

This agreement offers CLC students Guaranteed Admission to MU to complete their bachelor's degree. Students must meet all requirements outlined in this agreement to guarantee their admission to MU.

1. Academic Requirements

- a. Students must have received a high school diploma or equivalent (GED), complete a minimum of 24 transferable credit hours, and maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale with no grades earned of less than C. Students asked to leave CLC for academic or non-academic reasons will not be considered for guaranteed admission.
- b. Students are required to enroll in their MU degree program within three years of initial enrollment in the agreement. Courses accepted for transfer credit must follow MU's Transfer Course/Credit Policy. Courses numbered lower than 100-level and courses not deemed transferable are not included in this agreement.
- c. International students must demonstrate English language proficiency as part of the final admission process. Examples of accepted evidence are found in the MU international application guidelines.

2. Admission Requirements

- a. Students must sign and authorize CLC and MU to disclose their educational records, including but not limited to, transcripts, admission, and advising information as appropriate. Students agree to allow the two institutions to share information and allow reverse transfer credits. Students may also receive communication from MU informing them of presentations, workshops, activities, student events, and visits.
- b. Students must be in good academic and disciplinary standing at CLC at the time of transfer. Students must adhere to each institution's standard policies and procedures including but not limited to those dealing with admission, course enrollment, transfer credits, financial aid, student conduct and discipline, academic probation, dismissal, and reentry.

- c. During enrollment in the agreement, MU will provide advisement to students to discuss academic program requirements and transfer credit policies when initiated by the student. It is recommended that students track their degree progress by working with their transfer advisor at CLC and MU.
- d. This agreement applies to MU programs listed in Appendix A. Note, not all undergraduate programs are available through this agreement as some programs do not offer a transfer entry option or may not have spaces to offer in a given semester. Students interested in a MU program not listed in Appendix A should follow general transfer admission instructions and need not submit the agreement documents.
- e. The degree programs in the College of Business Administration, Opus College of Engineering, and College of Health Sciences have a higher cumulative GPA requirement of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Additionally, students must adhere to the listed requirements below for admission to the respective undergraduate degree program:
 - i. College of Business Administration – At minimum, three of the five courses must be completed; all completed courses must earn a grade of B or better.
 - ACC 121, ACC 122, MTH 224, ECO 221, ECO 222
 - ii. Opus College of Engineering - A grade of B or better in MTH 145, PHYS 123, and CHM 121.
 - iii. College of Health Sciences – A grade of B or better in BIO 161 and CHM 121.
- a. Students may also qualify for MU scholarships, including transfer specific scholarships viewable at <https://www.marquette.edu/explore/transfer-students-scholarships-and-financial-aid.php>
- f. Students may apply for Honors in the Disciplines at MU. A complete list of Disciplinary Honors Programs, their eligibility requirements, and application process can be found at <https://www.marquette.edu/honors/disciplinary-honors.php>.

3. Other Terms

- a. All students participating in the agreement must apply to MU using the Common Application or the MU Admission Application by the MU application deadline for the desired entry term.
- b. Failure to meet the requirements above does not preclude the student from applying and being considered for admission to MU using the traditional admission process.
- c. CLC and MU will publish a version of this document and related forms on its website, so the details of this agreement are available to students interested in participating in the program. MU and CLC will each have the right to review and approve all advertising for the agreement.

- d. This agreement is effective for three years and is subject to annual review. Any changes to the program regarding any part of this agreement, must be in writing so that this agreement can be re-evaluated. Notice of changes shall be provided at least 60 days prior to the first day of instruction (at both institutions) of the academic year in which the change will be implemented.
- e. Should the agreement be dissolved, students who have not yet secured an offer of admission to Marquette University will be considered for admission according to regular university transfer policy and deadlines.


