



**Guaranteed Transfer Admission Agreement Between
College of Lake County
And
Lincoln University**

College of Lake County and Lincoln University agree to a cooperative relationship through this Guaranteed Transfer Admission agreement to better serve students and facilitate the transfer process.

This agreement offers College of Lake County students guaranteed admission to Lincoln University to complete their Bachelor's degree; provided Students must meet all of the requirements outlined in this agreement to guarantee their admission to Lincoln University.

1. Academic Requirements

- a. Students have completed both ENG 121 and either ENG 122 or ENG 126 with grades of C or higher to meet the English proficiency requirements of Lincoln University. Students will not need to submit separate proof of English proficiency at the time of application.
- b. Students must have graduated from high school (as evidenced by a high school diploma or GED) and complete a minimum of 24-30 transferable credit hours and maintain a cumulative grade point average of (2.0) on a 4.0 scale on all transferrable course work taken at the College of Lake County prior to admission to the Guaranteed Transfer Admission program.
- c. Students are expected to enroll and complete general education and coursework required for admission into their Lincoln University degree program within three years of initial enrollment in the Guaranteed Transfer Admission program with a maximum of (60 credit hours) that will be applied to their baccalaureate degree. Courses numbered lower than 100-level and courses not deemed transferable are not included in this agreement.

2. Admission Requirements

- a. Students must authorize the College of Lake County and Lincoln University to disclose their educational records, including but not limited to, academics, admission, financial aid, and advising information as appropriate and to participate must sign the required participation form. By signing the participation form, students agree to allow the two institutions to share information and to allow the student to take advantage of the reverse degree process portion of the Guaranteed Admission program. Students may also receive communication from Lincoln University informing them of presentations, workshops, activities, student events, and visits.



- b. Students must be in good standing at College of Lake County at the time of transfer. Students must adhere to each institution's standard policies and procedures including but not limited to those dealing with admission, enrollment in courses, transfer credits, financial aid, student conduct and discipline, academic probation, dismissal and reentry.
- c. Students who achieve a transferrable GPA of (3.2) on a 4.0 scale will have guaranteed admission to the Honor's Program at Lincoln University and will also complete the additional application materials that are required to be admitted into the Honors Program.
- d. During enrollment in the Guaranteed Transfer Admission program, Lincoln University will provide advisement to students to discuss academic program requirements and transfer credit policies. It is recommended that students track their degree progress by working with their transfer advisor at College of Lake County and Lincoln University.
- e. Students are eligible to transfer into more than (30) undergraduate degree programs at Lincoln University. See Appendix for full list of participating degree programs. The degree programs of (Nursing and Education) have a higher GPA requirement of (2.5) and will have an additional application process to be considered, so are not included on the Appendix.
- f. Students are guaranteed the Lincoln Connection Scholarship which affords them in-state tuition.

3. Other Terms

- a. Failure to meet the requirements above does not preclude the student from applying and being considered for admission to Lincoln University using the traditional admission process.
- b. College of Lake County will publish this document on their website so that the details of this agreement are available to students interested in participating in the program. Lincoln University and College of Lake County will have the right to review and approve all advertising for the Guaranteed Transfer Admission program.
- c. By means of a separate Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), at the college's request, Lincoln University will facilitate the transfer of credit back to the College of Lake County if students transfer to Lincoln University before completing an associate's degree. The reverse transfer MOU enables the College of Lake County to award degrees following student transfer.
- d. This agreement will remain in effect until mutually agreed upon change is deemed necessary. Any changes to the program in regards to any part of this agreement, must be in writing so that this agreement can be re-evaluated. Notice of changes shall be provided at least 60 days prior to the first day of instruction (at both institutions) of the academic year in which the change will be implemented. Further, either party may terminate this agreement by providing the same



amount of notice.

- e. Should the program be dissolved, students who are participating at that time will be guaranteed transfer into Lincoln University provided they satisfy all program requirements.
